Midwives College of Utah participates in the <u>National Council of State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (NC-SARA) (http://nc-sara.org/)</u>. This agreement provides national policies rather than state-specific policies to enhance the overall quality of distance education. The range of educational activities regulated by this agreement is for distance education institutions.

Sharing licensure disclosure information with students demonstrates our institution's commitment to transparency, integrity, and student success. It also protects students from investing time and tuition dollars in a program that ultimately will not meet their licensure or career goals. This is particularly true in midwifery, where the CPM credential is recognized in the majority of states, but not in all, and where the status of direct-entry midwives varies widely. Therefore we are providing you with:

- A list of states where the program curriculum meets educational requirements for licensure.
- A list of states where the program curriculum does not meet educational requirements for licensure.
- A list of states where there are additional requirements for licensure.

You will want to research this topic regularly to stay informed, as state laws and regulations are subject to change. Because state licensure requirements can change, it is highly recommended that you contact the appropriate midwifery licensing agency in the state(s) you intend to practice midwifery to seek information and additional guidance before beginning and during enrollment in the Bachelor of Science in Midwifery program at Midwives College of Utah. The National Association of Certified Professional Midwives (NACPM) is the membership organization specifically representing Certified Professional Midwives (CPM) in the United States. They have prepared a series of briefing papers and recommendations, Midwifery Landscape and Future Directions for CPMs (http://nacpm.org/midwifery-landscape-and-future-directions-for-cpms/), "designed to answer questions and engage midwives in further conversations about the future of the profession."

- (1) Students in Arkansas and New Mexico must have a signed Preceptor/Apprentice Agreement
- (2) Licensure is expected to be available in Illinois in October, 2022
- (3) Student midwives in Louisiana, Montana, and South Carolina must obtain an apprentice license
- (4) Student midwives in California must complete some additional clinical and/or academic requirements in addition to their base MCU program in order to meet licensing requirements.
- (5) Indiana requires 20 observation births, attendance of 20 births conducted by a physician, 20 assistant births, 20 primary attendant births. All births must be in the U.S.
- (6) Student midwives in South Dakota and Wyoming must obtain a provisional license prior to practicing.
- (7) Utah is listed twice due to voluntary licensure
- (8) Direct-entry midwifery is illegal in Georgia as the state is not currently offering a route for licensure in Georgia.
